

Texas Documents: What are they good for?

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Problem:
TDOC Collection expands over 45 years and dozens of agencies. Narrowing down collection for scanning project in relation to University programs.

Solution:
Identified key university programs, then identified Texas agencies with documents that supported those programs.

The Unexpected

- Much more difficult to identify Texas documents in catalog than originally anticipated
- Believe there are many more documents that could be added, but aren't readily identifiable in catalog
- First student quit after a week to concentrate on her studies
- Matching metadata from OPAC with scanned documents required special naming conventions for the scanned items

Problem:
Our current print collection of Texas documents has very little exposure.

Solution:
By digitizing our collection, we expose our content to a broader audience. Four documents uploaded last year already have 560 views.

Great Opportunity to Partner with Special Collections

- SPCO librarian reviewed all titles for possible transfer to SPCO
- Allowed SPCO staff the chance to fine tune their department's collection development policy
- Digital Creation and SPCO staff forged good working relationships

Problem:
Our student budget is very small.

Solution:
We offered other staff a chance to learn to scan and work on this project.

What Does the Future Hold?

- Approximately 15,000 additional titles to be scanned if money/time permits
- Project could expand to a partnership arrangement with other Texas libraries
- Libraries would volunteer to pick a state agency and scan that agency's legacy documents
- Possible opportunity to work more closely with TSLAC and other Texas state agencies
