
Minority Health Panel Discussion

The Price of Manifest Destiny: Maps Relating to Wars in the Southwest Borderlands, 1800-1866

Approximately 100 rare maps are on display, including John Robinson's Map of Mexico, Louisiana, and the Missouri Territory; the first map to name Pike's Peak; Stephen F. Austin's map of Texas' and John Disturnell's "treaty map" used in negotiations to end the U.S.-Mexico War in 1848.
