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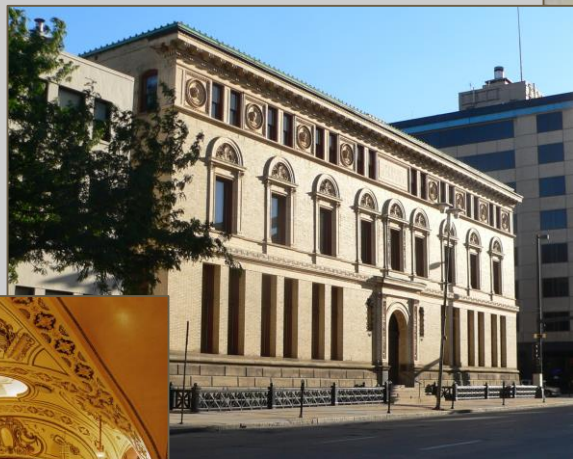

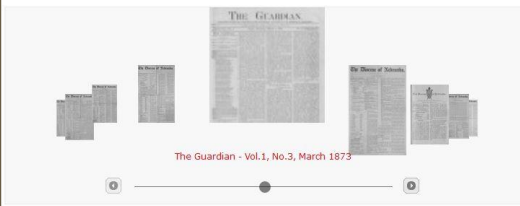

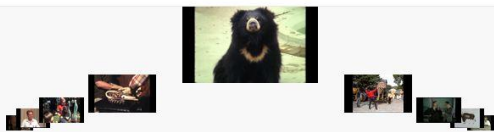

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The Queer Omaha Archives preserves Omaha's LGBTQIA+ history as part of the UNO Libraries' Archives & Special Collections. Historical materials documenting Omaha's diverse LGBTQIA+ communities are collected and made available to the public by archivists and librarians to more widely share Omaha's stories.

The Queer Omaha Archives is pleased to announce that UNO Libraries received a \$2,000 grant in August 2017 funded by Humanities Nebraska and the Nebraska Cultural Endowment. The project includes a [free oral history workshop](#) for the public and the collection of 20 oral history interviews. UNO Libraries will provide matching funds from the Queer Omaha Archives Fund (fund code 01139120) established with the University of Nebraska Foundation.

Books in Dari and Pashto

Dari (Persian) and Pashto are the two official languages of Afghanistan. Official government documents in Afghanistan are published in both languages. Most Afghans are bilingual and are fluent in both languages. About 50 percent of Afghans speak Dari, and some 40 percent speak Pashto. Other languages in Afghanistan include Farsi, Pashto, Uzbek, and Turkmen, Bakhti, Pashai, Hamilani, and others spoken by minority groups.

Dari and Pashto have extensive literature. Some of their greatest poets include Jalaluddin Rumi, Omar Khayyam, Ferdowsi, Khushk Khat Khattak and Rahman Baba. About 10 percent of the collection are in Dari and Pashto. Selected material from the collection have the area of Afghanistan studies.

The UNO Criss Library holds the Arthur Paul Afghanistan Collection, one of the largest and most comprehensive collections of Afghanistan materials outside of the country. It contains over 20,000 items in Dari, Pashto, and English.

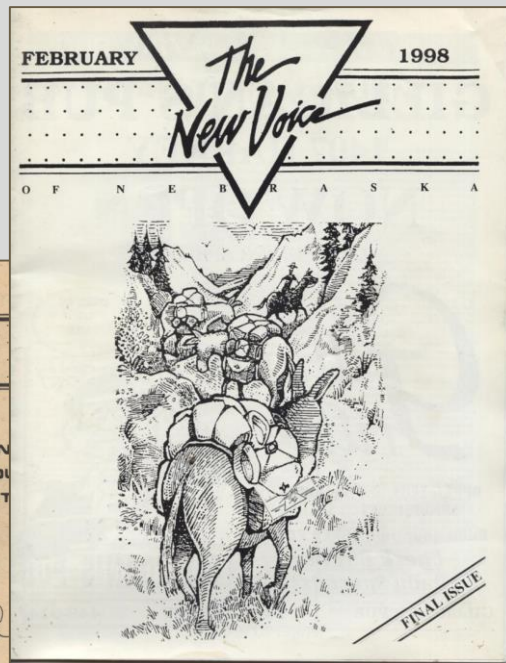
