AWARDED R-1: DOCTORAL UNIVERSITIES— VERY HIGH RESEARCH ACTIVITY

UTA was awarded R-1: Doctoral Universities—Very High Research Activity designation by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, the definitive list for the top doctoral research universities in the United States. This puts the University in an elite group of 131 institutions, including Harvard, MIT, and Johns Hopkins.

NO. 1 NATIONALLY: BEST FOR VETERANS

UTA ranks No. 1 nationally on Military Times' 2020 "Best for Vets: Colleges" list.

#5 FOR ETHNIC DIVERSITY

U.S. News & World Report ranked UTA with the fifth highest undergraduate ethnic diversity index among national universities in 2021.

TOP PERFORMERS ON SOCIAL MOBILITY

U.S. News & World Report ranked UTA No. 26 on its 2021 list of the "Top Performers on Social Mobility" among national universities.

NO. 1 IN TEXAS FOR ADULT LEARNERS

In its 2019 list of the top national universities, Washington Monthly magazine ranked UTA No. 1 in North Texas and No. 111 in the U.S. The University is also No. 2 in Texas and No. 63 nationwide for best universities for adult learners and No. 23 for "Best Bang for the Buck" in the southern U.S.

NO. 1 IN NORTH TEXAS FOR RETURN ON INVESTMENT

College Consensus named UTA as one of the best online colleges for return on investment on its 2019 list. UTA is No. 1 in North Texas and No. 34 nationally.

NO. 1 IN TEXAS FOR DEGREES AWARDED TO AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDENTS

According to the 2020 edition of Diverse: Issues in Higher Education magazine, UTA is No. 1 in Texas for awarding bachelor's and master's degrees to African American students. Nationally, the University is No. 11 for bachelor's degrees awarded to African American students and No. 14 for master's degrees. In addition, UTA is No. 17 for bachelor's degrees awarded to Hispanic students and No. 11 for master's degrees in the U.S., and is No. 1 in Texas and No. 17 nationally for master's degrees awarded to all minority students.

NO. 1 IN TEXAS FOR SERVING FIRST-GENERATION, LOW-INCOME STUDENTS

The educational nonprofit ScholarShot ranked UTA tied for first in Texas for serving first-generation, low-income students on its Texas Public University Report Card.

BEST UNIVERSITIES IN U.S.

Times Higher Education placed UTA 130th out of 181 universities in the United States on its 2021 World University Rankings.

3RD FASTEST GROWING DOCTORAL PUBLIC INSTITUTION IN THE U.S.

The Chronicle of Higher Education's Almanac (2019) ranked UTA as the third fastest-growing doctoral public institution in the country.

TOP 100 FOR HISPANIC STUDENTS

Hispanic Outlook on Education magazine ranked UTA among its top 100 universities nationwide for Hispanic students. It was No. 5 in architecture degrees, No. 24 in total graduate degrees, and No. 26 in total enrollment.

BEST SCHOOL FOR LATINOS

UTA was named one of the "Best Schools for Latinos" by Latino Leaders magazine.











Do you speak Spanish to your children, or not? % of parents saying ...


