IN MEMORIAM



D an Em ritu E. E. Davi

On December 13 1950, at the age of 69, Edward Everett Davis, Dean-Emeritus of Arlington State College, and until his retirement in 1945 administrative head of this institution for twenty years, died quietly in his sleep in a Fort Worth hospital.

He had come a long way, this great-grandson of Daniel Boone. From a pioneer ranch in West Texas in the 1880's, with scarcely enough boys in the county to have a baseball team, he had risen in forty years to be one of the outstanding junior college educators in the nation.

In simple justice the story of his achievement at this college should not be soon forgotten. Essentially it is this: he took a small, unknown institution, and in two decades, on the basis of sound scholarship and careful scholastic experiment, made it into one of the largest and most modern junior colleges in the nation. The function of education, he thought, is to fit youth to be intelligent and honorable citizens in the modern world. Whatever the past had to teach conducive to this, the dean sought eagerly. What was mere tradition, superstition, or ignorance he firmly rejected. "Look ahead, young man. The great days are yet to be," he said repeatedly.

It was not his fate to find here many easy, settled years. Depression and war stalked through his decades, but he beat them down, outlasted them and nursed the college through its perilous infancy.

Yes, he was a tough and grim old fighter when he had to be, one unafraid of the devil himself. But when you knew him, you found that he was strangely soft if his friends were in trouble, fond and even indulgent of the young; and when the storm clouds were down, gay and generous, liking nothing better than to be laughing and joking with his friends. The long-faced and over-solemn he could not abide.

When he retired, he thought at last to include his whim to grow roses, to fish in many a far-off stream, and to discuss the ideas of men and government with his friends. Unarmed and a little tired, he was surprised by death soon after he finished hoeing his winter garden.

The thousands of young men and women nearby who could not have been educated except for presence of this college owe him a salute and a prayer to God in thankfulness of his accomplishments.



J. G. (Klepto) HOLMES Athletic Director

Head football coach, and athletic director, J. G. Holmes, graduated from Alamo Heights High School in San Antonio in 1921, and the next year entered ASC, then NTAC. Here he was a football, basketball and baseball star until his graduation in 1924. He then went to Texas A. & M. and was graduated from there in 1927 when he was an All Southwest Conference guard.

During his Career Klepto has coached at several high schools and was line coach at A. & M. for four years before he came here in 1935.

Basketball, track and assistant football coach, T. J. Tinker received his experience as a player with TSC, or JTAC's teams, where he made a commendable record. After graduation from A. & M. in 1940, he came to ASC to coach. He served here three years and the Navy three years, returning in 1945.

Line coach, Burley Bearden, came to ASC in 1946. A star at Trinity University, Coach Bearden coached at Grand Prairie before he entered the Army, and compiled an enviable record there.

Outstanding players for the Riders were Joe Simpson, Charlie Lynch, Richard Harvell, and Elbert Spence.





Final results tabulated on the basketball squad show that Joe Simpson, Arlington's all-conference guard, walked away with the individual scoring crown for the 1951 basketball season.

A stout defensive player with a deadly eye for the basket, Joe was top scorer throughout the season. Charles Lynch, forward, finished in second place with a total of 164 points and George Harvell ran third in the scoring column with 123 points.

Percentages in the free throw department were very high this year with Lynch topping the list with a 631 average and Harvell was second with 623. Duane Durham was third with a 599 and Simpson was fourth with 568.
