Other activities for the year incuded a parade at the Rose Festival in Tyler and numerous parades in nearby cities.




CARSWELL AIR FIELD BOMBERS






The Arlington State eleven couldn't get started in the almost ankle deep mud, which the Cards ran wild in.

PARIS DRAGONS






SOCIAL SCIENCES—Charles Ogilvie

Majoring in Industrial Mechanical Engineering Rudy plans to work in Alaska upon his graduation from ASC.


BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION—James Robinson








GEOLOGY



METHODIST STUDENT UNION


