Coach Claude "Cheena" Gilstrap, the Arlington State head football coach for the last two seasons, was picked for the second time by Texas sport writers as the "Outstanding Junior College Coach of the Year". His team posted an 8-2 won-lost standing, totaling 16 victories against three losses in two years as the Rebel grid mentor.

Headed by Coach Claude Gilstrap, the ASC coaching staff tutored a group of recruits and freshman into a powerhouse eleven which rose to national rating in junior college grid circles.


Coach Burley Bearden, Reb line mentor, became a full-time coach for the first time while at ASC. He again organized a forward wall that ranked high with any junior college team in the country. Coach Tommy Tinker turned in another creditable job as scout and instructor for backs and ends in his 14th year on the Rebel coaching staff.




Football in 1954




Arlington State's Rebel football team opened the 1954 season with its toughest schedule in its history. Six of the seven returning lettermen were in the line, but there were many holes to gap and positions to strengthen in the Reb forward wall.

All-Conference halfback, Johnny Symank, was the lone backfield veteran, causing three starting vacancies in the secondary.


Coaches Claude Gilstrap, Burley Bearden and Tommy Tinker spent the spring and summer on the hunt for new faces so as to defend the Pioneer Conference crown and last season's 8-1 record.

The Wharton Pioneers was the first test for the Rebels on the opponents homefield. The ASC fans quickly learned the name of the new Reb quarterback, Raymond Glasgow, as the Arlington boy passed for two touchdowns in leading the Rebels to a 19-7 victory over Wharton.



Kilgore's mighty Rangers was the Reb's next non-conference opponent. In the 1953 season, Arlington's lone loss was at the hands of this East Texas crew and whispers of revenge were in the air at ASC's Memorial Stadium that Friday evening.


Kilgore, the team that had averaged 50 points in two previous games, quickly jumped to a lead, having a 16-0 edge at the half.

Freshman fullback, Billy Pavliska, turned the tide in the third quarter with a 86-yard touch-

down run. After the kick-off, Ken Watson covered a Ranger fumble and four plays later Glasgow went over from the one. End Bill Hunnicutt covered another fumble in the last period that set up Pavliska's clinching tally that gave ASC a 20-16 win, and Kilgore's only loss of the entire season.


The Rebels had disposed of two strong non-conference teams but another one was up next. Paris proved to be tough opposition but a three yard thrust by Pavliska in the closing minutes of the game slew the Dragons, 7-0.

Navarro was an easier foe for the Rebs, but the blue and white machine did not begin to roll until the second stanza. Freshman quarterback, Jimmy Hardin, started the first pay dirt drive by guiding the Rebels down to the one, setting up Barfield's final thrust. Glasgow later tallied for another, followed by Pavliska's two touchdowns, that gave the Rebels a 28-7 victory.





clinched the win on a 61-yard run in the third period. Lineman Wayne Coble, Cecil Jacobson, Don Barnett and Jimmy Gilbreath held the Vikings in check by outstanding defensive work. Arlington State ran up its biggest score of




the season in its first loop game with Schreiner. Two touchdowns by Symank and Pavliska, totaled to tallies by Rogers Bruce and Hardin, gave the Rebels a 39-7 victory. Conversions were made by Glasgow and Andy Seward.

A homecoming crowd of 4,000 saw the Rebels continue their winning streak by trouncing the strong San Angelo eleven, 33-7. The Rebels outstanding halfback, Alton Grimes, scored three touchdowns and Glasgow passed for two more to Watson and Pavliska.

Ranger's Rangers rallied for three touchdowns in the final period to score a 21-14 upset victory over the Rebels. ASC lead at half-time, 14-2, on touchdowns by Pavliska and Grimes. In the final quarter Ranger scored from its own 42 in three plays and from the 43 in seven tries, tying the Rebels 14-14.

ASC scored a two-point safety in the opening



From then on, Arlington State decisively took over the game as Symank scored on a pass from Glasgow, and Barfield tallied from the one after three completed passes by Hardin.

The Rebels were badly battered and beaten after playing the rough and tumble Aggies.



Tarleton State, the rival school for 29 years, had been idle that week and were ready for the once beaten Rebels, both spiritually and physically.





Tarleton's Gene Ward was the big thorn in the side of the Rebels scoring three touchdowns,


intercepting a pass and prevented another ASC touchdown by making a last-man tackle.

The loss destroyed any hopes of a post-season bowl bid for the Rebs, of which, they were definite contenders for an appointment to the Little Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California.

Although two conference defeats left Arlington State in a third place tie in the loop, the Rebels lead the other teams in All-Conference selections, Coach Gilstrap was voted the outstanding junior college mentor, and every one knew ASC had one of its greatest teams in its history.
