## HISTORY of the CORPS OF CADETS

Since the inception of military training at this institution in 1902 when it was the Carlisle Military Academy, hundreds of outstanding young men and women have been prepared for service as officers in the U.S. Army. The ROTC Program as we know it today began when the institution became a part of the Texas A&M system in 1917. The college offered two years of college training and was known as Grubbs Vocational College. ROTC was mandatory for all male students of the college until the spring of 1954 when ROTC was changed to a curriculum. The cadets were an integral part of University life because the Corps was intertwined with most campus activities. This close feeling has continued even until today. In the fall of 1959 the University became a four year college and by the spring of 1961 the first class graduated with 8 officers receiving commissions. Since that date over 609 officers have been commissioned through the Arlington ROTC Program. In October of 1956, the ROTC unit was transferred to The University of Texas system. On May 17, 1968, Department of Army General Order Number 20 was published and formally established The University of Texas at Arlington ROTC unit as a separate Army ROTC organization.

Today, the Corps of Cadets of The University of Texas at Arlington is the second largest corps in the State of Texas. Its growth stems from a proud history and is a recognition and realization of its current excellence.

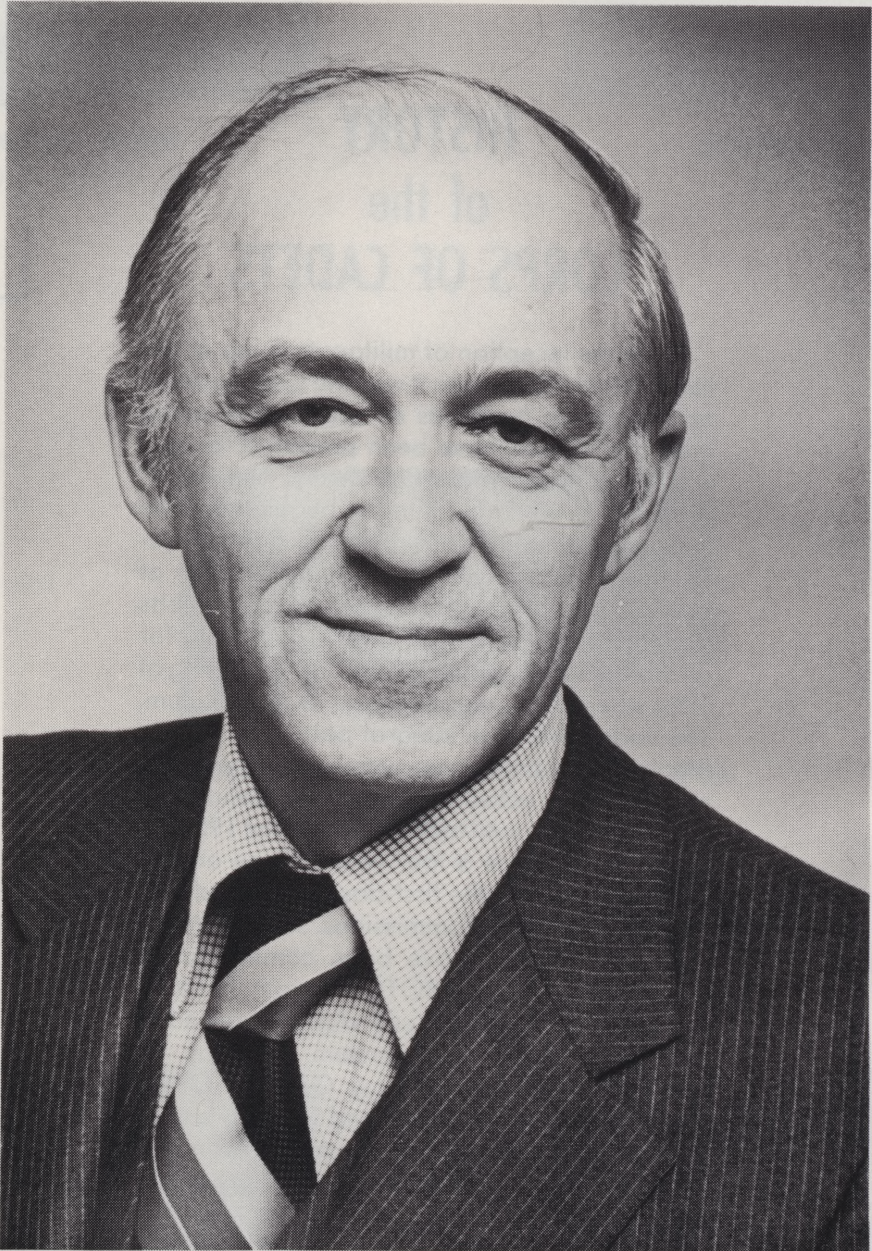

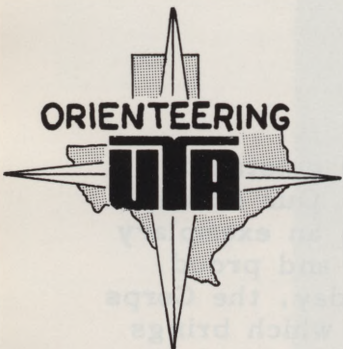




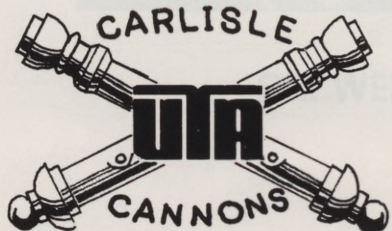
## PMS MESSAGE

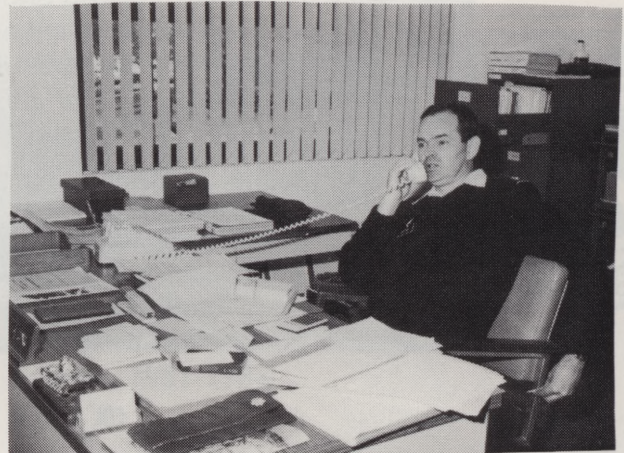

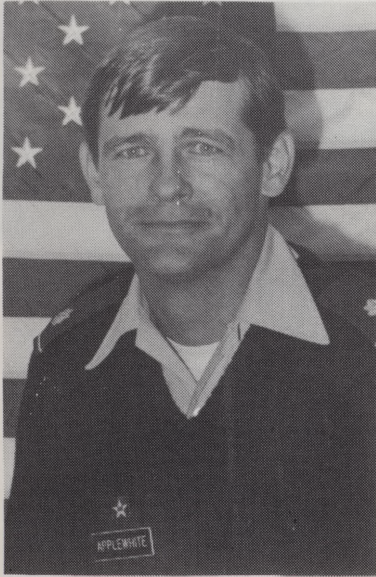

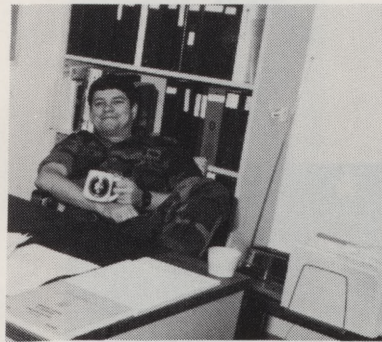
MAJ Michael P. Applewhite

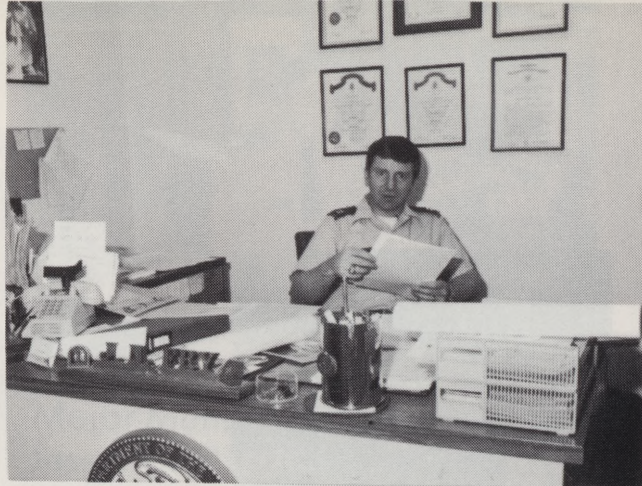

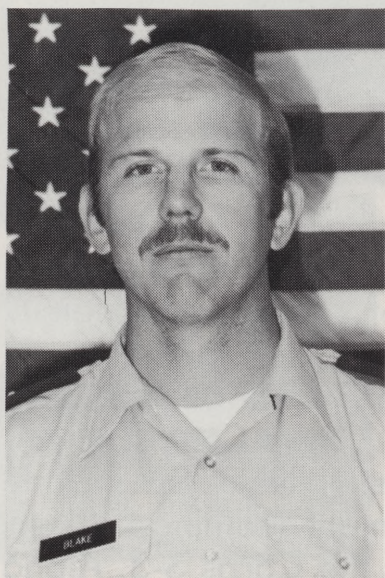

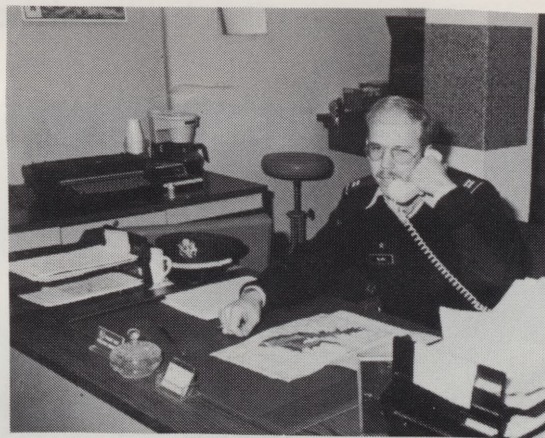
CPT James Fry

Mrs. Bell is the Military Science Department's Secretary and Receptionist. It is her friendly voice that has been answering the Department's line for the past four and a half years.



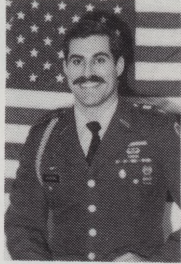

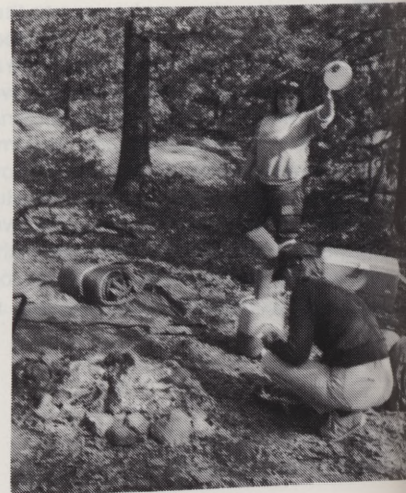
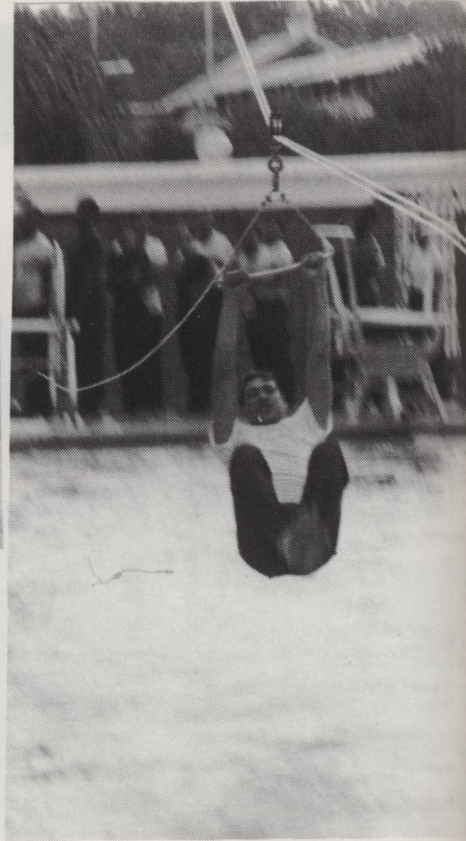
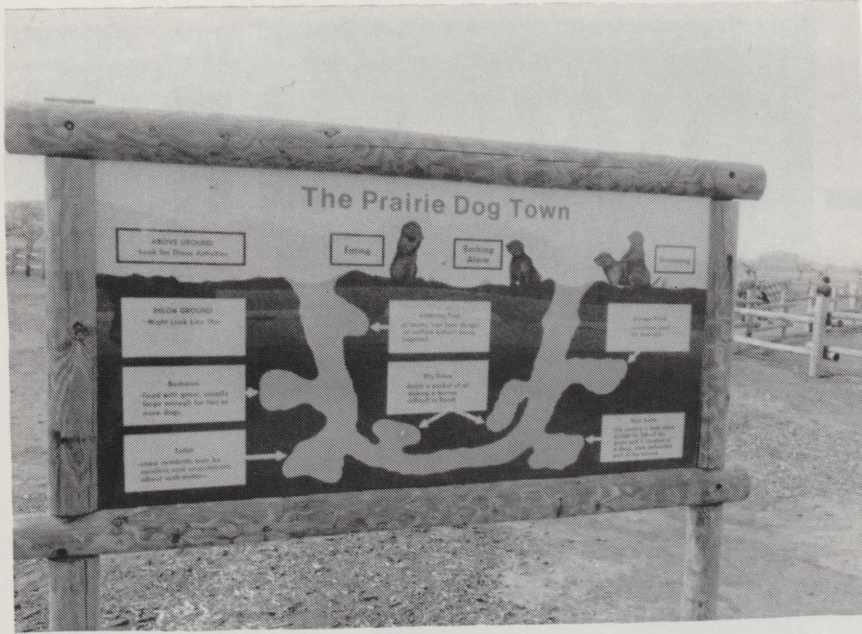
(1) Commit their lives to Jesus Christ.

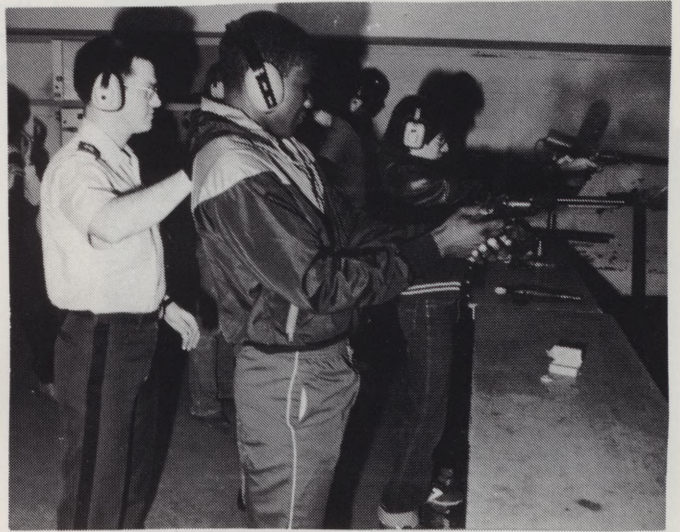

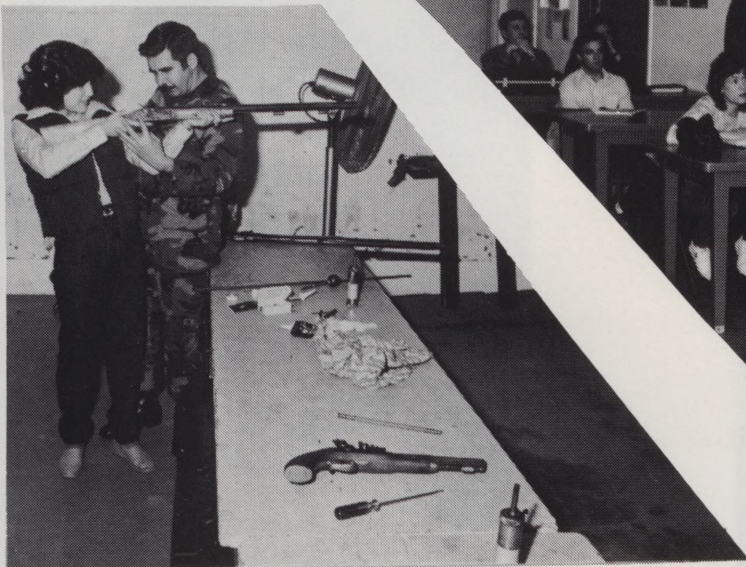

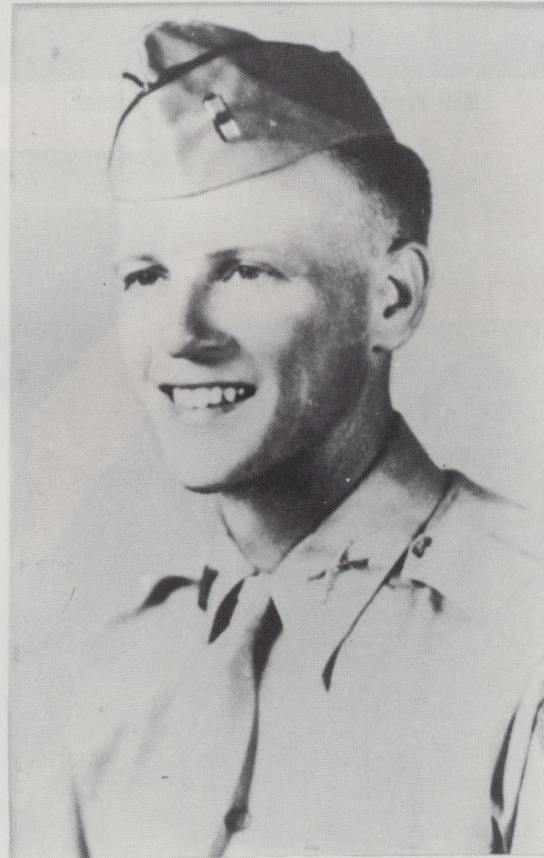

# HALL OF HONOR

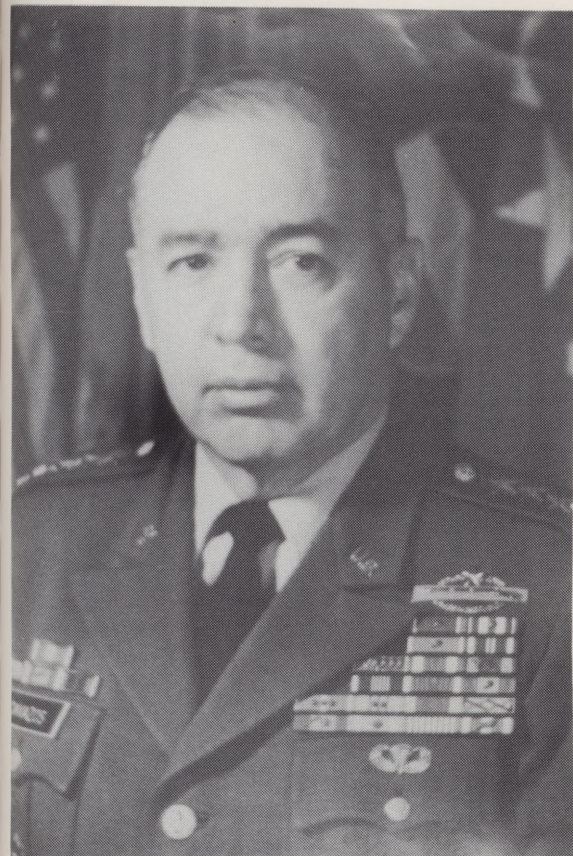
