The Aggies again suffered defeat when they met the Paris Dragons. J. B. Smith's continued long punting was a major factor in keeping the score down to 6-0.

The Junior Aggie-Weatherford Coyote game featured Carl Knox and Buford Hudgins in a passing attack which won the game for the Aggies, 26-14.

The following week Schreiner Institute beat the Aggies 38-0.

The San Angelo Rams handed the Aggies their third defeat in conference play, 7-0.

Playing in Jacksonville, the Aggies beat the Lon Morris Bearcats by a score of 13-0. Alanough the game was played in freezing weather, the Aggies' passing attack was used to advantage.

In the Thanksgiving Day game against Hillstoro, the N.T.A.C. team was at its best and beat the Indians, 32-0. Touchdowns were made by Threatt, Sharp, Croft, Hudgins, and Rogers. The entire squad of thirty-six men played in this game.

The final game of the season was lost to the Tarleton Plowboys. This game was the last one for players Jack Smith, Albert Clark, and Harlen Hood, who fought until the final sound of the gun.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON

The Hillsboro Indians were the first to defeat the Junior Aggies. The score was 34-28. However, the determined N. T. A. C. basketeers won their next game against the T. C. U. Freshmen by a 21-19 count.

In Wichita Falls the Aggies defeated the Hardin Junior College Indians for the second time with a score of 46-34.

At Decatur the Aggies were beaten by the Decatur Baptists, 42-37.

The Weatherford Coyotes defeated N. T. A. C. in a return contest, 42-22.

The Aggies lost the final game of the season to the Tarleton Plowboys by a score of 46-32.

In the conference meet, seventeen junior colleges were represented.




