



OUR PRESIDENT.

No one is more symbolic of the rapid and spectacular progress of Arlington State College than is President Jack R. Woolf. Since he assumed the presidency in 1959, when the school attained four-year status, ASC has truly "gone places." To guide a small junior college through the vicissitudes of becoming a large institution of prestige and stature requires the special qualities, youth, hard work, and dedication which Dr. Woolf displays.

Although only forty years of age, Dr. Woolf has had vast teaching experience in the field of engineering, and service in deanships. Before coming to ASC as Dean of the College in 1957, he was Assistant to the Dean of Engineering at Texas A and M, and taught there as well as at Purdue and SMU. A Registered Professional Engineer, Dr. Woolf is a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. He has done extensive research and writing, and is considered an authority in the areas of heat transfer and thermo dynamics. The Tarrant County Chapter of the Texas Society of Professional Engineers honored President Woolf with the "Engineer of the Year" Award in 1962; the Arlington JC's named him

THE BIG YEAR . . .

when over 10,000 students arrived on the Arlington State College campus, breaking previous records to become Texas' 4th largest of the 20 state-supported four-year colleges and universities. From the beginning, there was a new spirit . . . a feeling of big things to come.

Students saw a new and changing look to the old campus. Shining facades of the new men's dorm, Trinity House; the new wing of Lipscomb Hall for women; and the air-conditioned addition to Science Hall, housing the most advanced accommodations and equipment, were the most noticeable of the new look. Old structures surrounding the campus were gradually disappearing, making room for new facilities.

Trojan work made ready for occupancy in February the magnificent Library which both students and faculty had long needed. On into spring the artistic part of the new look developed as the Quadrangle took shape between the Science and Library buildings, reorienting the campus to the south and west, with landscaping, new sidewalks and streets.

Plans for new parking lots to accommodate 5 to 6,000 more automobiles, an athletic track — building plans for a theater, a gymnasium, a campus hospital, and an outdoor swimming pool — contracts let for new housing after razing of the old Rebel Village — all were part of the big-year plans. By now, students and faculty have learned to accept and work with some strange visitors on campus — the dozers, cats, and cement mixers are apparently here for a long stay.

Other big-year boosts to the "going places" feeling at ASC were: the big-figure budget (largest in the A and M system); 57 new faculty members, raising the total to 278; the promising possibility of graduate programs in the near future; the campus-produced movie beamed over KRLD-TV; mush-rooming men's fraternities; the affiliation of athletics with the newly formed Southland Conference; and completion of the gigantic Self-Study submitted to the Southern Association of Colleges and Universities. The visiting committee of the Association came to the campus in April to report back for the all-important decision of acceptance of ASC — its most important academic step since four-year status.

Going places? Arlington State College surely is!







A dance in the Student Center was the final event in a busy ASC Homecoming week.





























THE WORLD OF DRAMA

Students who work in Little Theater, ASC's drama group, soon become aware that the world of drama is not just glamour, romance, and excitement, but long hours of hard work and perseverance toward the satisfaction of success. Under the direction of Professor Richard L. Slaughter, Little Theater presents one production each semester of the long term school year. "The World of Carl Sandburg" was performed on December 5, 6, and 7 in the tradition of the modern theater. Tall stools for the performers, music stands for their scripts, and a small podium to represent Sandburg's place were the only props used on a bare stage, usually blacked out except for a spot on the person reciting. Familiar folk songs and ballads, sung by a guitarist, tied together the prose and poetry selections of Sandburg, some yet unpublished. The program was built around the central themes of the poet's works-childhood, love, hate, war, and death.

THE WORLD OF MUSIC

The student, either dorm resident or commuter, is surrounded by music, whether it be blaring from a car radio or sounding forth from a snack bar public address system. The importance of music in college activities is clear. Most of the Convocation performances, such as those of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and Peter Nero, are musical. Music is, of course, a necessity for the weekly dances and the big formal balls. Concerts by the campus musical organizations, recitals, and special programs, such as this year's spring production of "Brigadoon" by the Concert Choir, are frequently offered for music lovers. And, isn't it hard to imagine a Rebel football game without the rousing sound of band music?

THE WORLD OF ART

In a remote spot on the Arlington State campus stand two small buildings throbbing with creativity and imagination. Classes that vary from Advertising Design to Life Drawing, and from Art History to Graphics prepare students for the art world. Aiming to give all students a measure of art appreciation, the department, headed by Professor Howard Joyner, provides weekly galleries in the Student Center. Works of both amateur



and professional artists are represented. The outdoor art sale is a popular part of the annual April Fine Arts in Dimension week. ASC art students have the opportunity to profit from their efforts, and lucky purchasers obtain quality art at reasonable prices.




FOOTBALL '63










Roger Richardson dashes downfield in the game with ETSC as Mike Cook, end, approaches to provide interference.










Norris Weir's tracking is fine as the ball leaves his hand for the basket.

Bruce Tibbets and Phil Gist go up in an attempt to control the backboard against free running Midwestern.







RESEARCH:

ASC'S THRUST INTO THE FUTURE

Moving ahead at sonic speed is Arlington State's research program — today's true test of the dynamic quality of an institution of higher learning.

PSYCHOLOGY

COLOR VISION

Dr. Garvin McCain, Head of the Department of Psychology, is engaged in a significant project under a \$13,000-plus grant from NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration). The purpose: to project the environmental effects of long-term stimulation of colored light on human capacity for color vision. ASC voluntary student-guinea pigs were measured for their capacity for color before donning the specially designed filter-goggles. After wearing their "blinders" for 6 to 144 hours, their color-vision aptitude was again measured. ASC's contribution to astronauts' relationship to the spectrum of outer space?

PHYSIOLOGY


Significant to the realm of behavior is the physiological work being conducted under the direction of Dr. James Phillips. To determine how different parts of the brain function, Dr. Phillips, with the aid of lab assistants, injects electrodes—small electrical currents—into the brains of the white rats used in laboratory research. Extensive recording is done to track the effects of the electrodes, which remain injected permanently. In addition, the electrodes are used to allow observance of the effect of stimulae on the brain. Chemical work being conducted on the rats is through the injection, by way of small hollow tubes, of different drugs into the brain to determine the effects.

ANIMAL RESEARCH

Dr. Phillips' research with the fresh-water porpoises in the Ft. Worth city zoo has produced some startling results. Heretofore considered totally blind, the porpoises have been proved capable of determining shapes and certain images. Now, the investigation is aimed at determining how well the porpoises can see, and if they can discern color.




Dr. James Phillips and Don Walker prepare a rat for an electrode injection.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

LABORATORY EQUIPMENT

The Foreign Language Department is conducting an experiment in learning with approximately \$9,000 worth of new equipment in the language lab.

The facilities consist of tape recorders in each booth in the lab. These recorders enable the student to tape his voice while he repeats his lesson into the microphone. He can then take this tape and play it back to find his own mistakes in grammar and pronunciation.

Mr. Virgil Poulter, Assistant Professor, is in charge of the lab and the equipment.

HISTORY

TEXAS INDUSTRY

Contributing to the industrial history of Texas is Dr. E. C. Barksdale, Head and Professor, Department of History, Government, and Sociology. An authority in the field of Southwestern geography, Dr. Barksdale has been studying for five years the origins of Texas industrial development. His research has already led to important publications dealing specifically with the genesis of the aviation and meatpacking industries in Texas.

URBAN SOCIOLOGY

Mr. Blaine T. Williams, Assistant Professor of Sociology, and specialist in Urban Sociology, has been engaged for the past two years in completing a study entitled "Population and Cultural Factors in the Growth of Dallas, Texas." Part of the research has already been published. Professor Williams is attempting to show, through the application of sociological tests, that the key to the rapid growth of Dallas and its environs lies in a combination of factors which include its unusual historical background, the charter of its population, and its community leadership.

ASC HISTORY

Dr. Clarence P. Denman, Professor of History, is researching and writing the history of Arlington State College, from the time of its establishment as a private academy in 1895. Since no official records of the school's early years are available, Dr. Denman, a specialist and author in the field of colonial history, is obtaining his information from surviving alumnae and existing files of the *Arlington Journal*.



VAPOR DEPOSITION

Dr. Rayford Hoyle, under an American Electroplaters' Society grant, is directing a theoretical study of the chemical vapor deposition process in a flow system. The kinetics of the system are being determined in order to obtain the mechanism of the process. A better understanding of the mechanisms involved in chemical vapor deposition should lead to improved coatings, an easier choice of catalysts for the processes and predictability of conditions necessary for plating. The plating of nickel from nickel carbonyl is now being studied.


VISUAL AIDS

Professor Carl W. Scharf has been working for the past two years in conjunction with Creative Visuals of Dallas to produce a series of overhead projector transparencies and visual aid devices to supplement text-book presentation of numerous chemistry subjects. This effort is providing schools and colleges throughout the country with improved teaching aids and, at the same time, has provided ASC, at no cost, \$800 worth of transparencies for its Chemistry Department projectors.

SYNTHESIS OF ALKYNE ETHERS

Chemistry Department research under Dr. John T. Murchison, Head, involves the synthesis of alkyne ethers. The aim is to produce new compounds, which will be a useful intermediate for the synthesis of other compounds. The major concern at present is to evolve a satisfactory method for obtaining the compounds in pure form.

SOLID STATE RESEARCH

The Solid State Research Section of the Physics Department, under the direction of Dr. B. J. Marshall, is in the second year of a \$22,000 Welsh Foundation grant for a study of the ferroelectric properties of certain alum crystals. These crystals are grown in the lab by five senior and four junior physics majors, who also conduct the experiments in the manner of graduate studies. Classed as a basic research problem, the study is aimed at a better understanding of the present unclarified theory of alum crystals, which contain a different structure to other ferroelectric crystals. Equipment in the lab includes an air liquifier and a 12-inch electromagnet. The latter equipment is being used for magnetoaccoustics and magnetoresistance studies of the crystals to determine transport properties in metals. An X-ray studies program will be directed on the crystals to verify the accuracy of the results. Publication of the findings is expected to be in The Physical Review.

GEOLOGY

X-RAY DIFFRACTION EQUIPMENT

A special feature in the Geology Department this year is the X-ray Diffraction equipment being used by students in the Sedimentation Course under the direction of Professor C. F. Dodge. This equipment, provided by the Science Building Fund, is used on any unknown material (clay minerals are usually used) for mineral identification. It is useful to other departments, such as chemistry and physics, for the identification of substance structure of unknown material.

GEOLOGY FIELD TRIP

Professor Dodge this year directed a significant geology field trip to examine the Woodbine formation at fifteen different locations in the Arlington area. Members of ASC Geological Society were hosts to Baylor University geology professors and students for the trip. The Woodbine formation, which comes to the surface here, extends into Kaufman, Gregg, Smith, and Rush counties, where, at several thousand feet below the surface, it traps the valuable East Texas oil field. Northward it extends up into Denton, on west of Sherman and Denison, and runs due east along the Red River almost into Arkansas.

The purpose of the field trip was to observe the ancient coastal deposits laid down around 1.00 million years ago when the shoreline ran through the Arlington area.
