Student Print Quota In Effect Spring 2006

Beginning in the spring semester 2006, UT Arlington students will have a \$70 quota for free printing using OIT and Library printers during the spring/summer semesters. This quota calculates to 700 pages of single-sided B&W laser printing at \$.10 per page or 933 pages of double-sided B&W laser printing at \$.15 per sheet. Once a student has used his/her quota then he/she will have to pay for all subsequent printing for the academic year. Students will use their Mav Money account for this purpose. During the fall semester of 2006, the quota for the academic year will be \$100. Students will need their Mav Express Card to release all print jobs.
